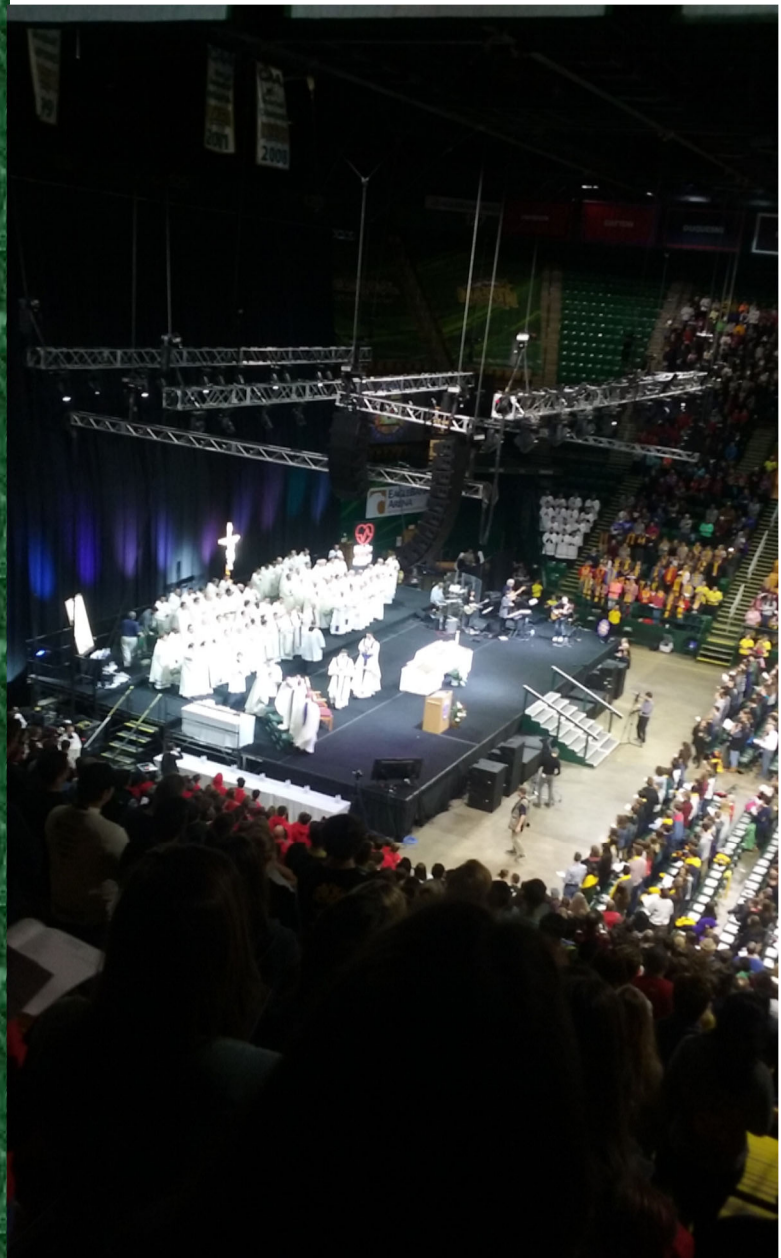

Be Prophets!

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The prophetic call and the fear of rejection are part of prophetic mission. Moses tried to convince Yahweh that he didn't speak well enough, and Jeremiah complained to God that he was too young. The prophets trembled at the trials ahead of them-and with good reason. Israel had a long history of rejecting prophets. Jeremiah was threatened with death several times, thrown into an empty, muddy cistern, imprisoned, dragged off to exile in Egypt, and perhaps most painful of all, was forced to watch the destruction of Jerusalem because its inhabitants would not listen to his message. At least twice in his lifetime, the prophet Elijah spoke the truth of God to King Ahab of Israel concerning the king's promotion of idolatry. As a result, Elijah was forced to flee into the wilderness where he suffered great privation. John Quincy Adams, the sixth president of the United States and the son of a former president, reportedly said that he would rather clean filth from the streets than be president. Scripture tells us that most of the prophets shared John Quincy Adams's feelings of inadequacy to their calling. Today's Gospel story is another example of why the prophets did not jump for joy at their career prospects. The people of Nazareth turn from amazement to such fury at Jesus' words that they seized him and dragged him off to the cliff to murder him. Speaking God's truth by word or by deed isn't less dangerous even today. Hundreds of missionaries have been murdered in history. Christians are subjected to the White Martyrdom of mental torture in many advanced countries by the agnostic and atheistic media and liberal politicians and judges, as forms of the media ridicule and insult Christians with even unprecedented vengeance.

We pray that the shepherds of the Church be strengthened as true prophets of the time, that they have courage to proclaim the truth of the Gospel. May the martyrs of the Kingdom of God be models for the shepherds of today. Please pray for your shepherds.

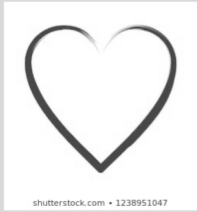

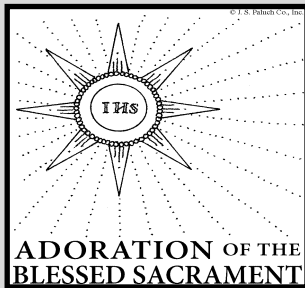

Individuals must have no Medicare, Medicaid, or private insurance, meet specific income criteria (such as a level of income for a family of four at \$50,200), and show proof of Morgan County residency.

Call 317.831.1697 with questions or to schedule an appointment on the first or third Saturday of each month between 8:00 am - 1:00 pm. Patients receive a medical exam from a Nurse Practitioner or Physician, lab tests, radiology tests, and medications as necessary, all at no charge.
